

1) Badass Trees for Piss-Poor Places

Originally titled "Good Trees for Bad Places," it was determined by a committee of sobriety-challenged but internationally renowned horticulturists that the name needed an upgrade. The trees in this talk are survivors. They beg for poor soil, taunt droughts, laugh at incorrect planting technique, scoff at mulch volcanoes, and mock bad pruning cuts. Sure, some of the usual suspects, but the talk also includes some you probably don't know. It also uses some of the trees as launch pads into discussion of, and even challenge, some tree-planting concepts. Enjoy this romp through trees so ornery they'll resist the worst that is hurled at them and be there to shade your children's children's children.

2) Planting for Pollinators

We all know that pollinators are under pressure. Fortunately, our urban and suburban gardens and landscapes are easily (and beautifully) tailored to provide much of the plant diversity upon which pollinators depend. This talk sets the context and then provides the tools for any homeowner to do real conservation literally in their own backyards.
